UWLES partners with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library ™ to provide any young child birth-five in Dorchester, Somerset, Wicomico & Worcester Counties the opportunity to receive a free book each month by mail to their home.

Through our SmartStart collaboration, over 3,000 newborns have been enrolled and received their first book before leaving TidalHealth! To date, we have delivered nearly 544,000 books to over 19,000 children on the Lower Shore. Scan or visit https://www.uwles.org/ImaginationLibrary.





United For ALICE is a driver of innovation, research, and action to improve life across the country for ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) and for all. Through the development of the ALICE data trends, a comprehensive, unbiased picture of financial hardship has emerged.

Harnessing this data and research on the mismatch between low-paying jobs and the cost of survival, ALICE empowers anyone to convene, advocate, and collaborate on solutions that promote financial stability at local, state, and national levels. UWLES partners with SingleCare to improve the health and well-being of neighbors by making prescription medication more affordable for individuals with high prescription costs. The SingleCare Prescription Savings card, accepted at more than 60,000 pharmacies nationwide, covers all FDA approved prescription medications. Free to all consumers, both insured and uninsured, the card can provide an average savings of 42%, and also includes pet medications.

Consumers can download a card from https://www.uwles.org/SingleCare and create a free account. Or, reach out to UWLES directly for a card. When you download the SingleCare app, you can price check costs, find instant savings and get health tips. Last year, local Lower Eastern Shore neighbors saved around \$99,000.



Wellness Made Easy is a health literacy curriculum raising awareness and addressing barriers to achieving good health. The program also makes additional health literacy materials available through partnerships with public libraries, nonprofit partners, and healthcare providers. Information is currently available in English, Haitian Creole and coming soon, Spanish.
